The upcoming season of "Running Wild with Bear Grylls" features Courteney Cox, Julianne Hough, Vanessa Hudgens, Nick Jonas and Lindsey Vonn taking on the elements in the great outdoors. Cox will be traveling to Ireland, Hough will be in Africa, Hudgens and Jonas are going to the Sierra Nevada Mountains while Vonn heads to Corsica in the Mediterranean Sea.

CASTING

Carly Pope, known for "Popular" and "The Tomorrow People," will have a guest role on USA Network's "Suits" when it returns July 13. Pope will play Tara Messer, a cultured and perceptive commercial architect, who Louis brings in to help separate him from Stu and the traders.

"The \$100,000 Pyramid" returns to ABC on June 26 at 9 p.m. with an all-star cast of celebrities set to partner with contestants from across the country to compete for the ultimate prize of \$100,000. Celebrity guest line-ups include Martha Stewart vs Snoop Dogg, Sherri Shepherd vs Anthony Anderson, Robin Roberts vs Mario Cantone, Ana Gasteyer vs Rachel Dratch, Rosie O'Donnell vs Kathy Najimy and more.

Brett Eldredge and Thomas Rhett will host the "CMA Music Festival: Country's Night to Rock" on August 3 at 8 p.m. on ABC.

"I've played my heart out on every size stage at CMA Fest, from the crowds of 20 to the big stadium, because I love the energy of the festival and the country music fans so much," said Eldredge. "And now I get to host the whole thing with one of my best pals. You can't beat that!"

"As a fan, CMA Music Fest was always the biggest event of the year for me. Some of my favorite memories are me and my buddies sitting in the nosebleeds watching our heroes play," added Thomas Rhett. "It's surreal and a huge honor to be hosting and performing on this stage."

The announcement was made today by Chris McCumber, President, Entertainment Networks, NBCUniversal Cable Entertainment, to whom she will report.


