

10 great places to indulge your senses

"It's a day you're supposed to indulge your senses," she says. From spa visits to hikes to sharing a memorable view, there are plenty of ways to treat your sweetie — and yourself. Cathedral Rock

Sedona, Ariz.

New Age believers say the northern Arizona city of Sedona is surrounded by energyemitting vortexes. Stanger, who has hiked the steep three-quarter-mile trail to one such spot, thinks there's something to it. "When I go there, I get a feeling of peace and healing. And it increases your sex drive. Willis Tower Skydeck

Chicago

There may be no better place to share a first kiss than standing on a glass-floored deck 103 stories above the ground. "They say high altitude increases the adrenaline flow to make you feel like you're in love," Stanger says. The view from the tallest building in the USA is memorable, too. Marker 88 Restaurant

Islamorada, Fla.

You can't beat the Keys for romance, Stanger says. This beach-side restaurant offers views of dolphins frolicking in the ocean, along with proposal-worthy sunsets. Santa Fe

This day spa, inspired by Japanese hot-spring resorts, offers an elegant and tranquil place to share some private time with your sweetheart. Stanger suggests a soak together in a hot tub and then a couple's massage. You can even order in food and spend your day there. Aspen, Colo.

Aspen may be a Western ski town, but you can find the flavor of Asia at this elegant sushi restaurant. Stanger suggests reserving one of the "Rock Star Booths" for privacy. "It's the make-out booth," she says. A couple can snuggle and pour each other glasses of sake — the Japanese rice wine is said to be an aphrodisiac, she says. Los Angeles

Art can stir passion, and this grand museum doesn't disappoint, Stanger says. It's where she went on her second date with her boyfriend. "There are little places to get lost. He stole a kiss." Along with art, there are memorable city views from the cliff-top museum. She also suggests stopping at the cafe. "The wine is amazing. It's off the chain. New York

This "recreational cooking school" in New York's Chelsea neighborhood offers a full calendar of classes, along with an area to enjoy drinks and snacks. A special Valentine's night session on edible aphrodisiacs focuses on oysters. Students will learn shucking, cooking and how the bivalves are raised. Austin

It's hard not to have fun when you're out on the town in Austin, Stanger says. "The music is very eclectic. There's a little bit of something for everybody."
